

## INDIAN PANORAMA – 2010

### REGULATIONS

#### 1. SHORT TITLE

These Regulations may be called the Indian Panorama - 2010 Regulations and shall come into force with immediate effect.

#### 2. DEFINITIONS

In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise refers,

- (a) "Board" means the Central Board of Film Certification.
- (b) "Directorate" means the Directorate of Film Festivals, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting.
- (c) "Indian Panorama" is a section of the International Film Festival of India. "Indian Panorama" means the group of films selected in terms of the provisions given in these Regulations for participation in National and International Film Festivals
- (d) "Producer" includes an individual producer, a production company, Government department or a Government-recognized Institute that produces a film.
- (e) "Right Holder" means the owner of the negative who is authorized to order prints of cinematographic films on the laboratory for a particular film.

#### 3. AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The aim of the Indian Panorama, organised by the Directorate is to select feature and non-feature films of cinematic, thematic and aesthetic excellence, for the promotion of film art through the non-profit screening of these films in:

- (1) International Film Festivals in India and abroad
- (2) Indian Film Weeks held under Bilateral Cultural Exchange Programmes and Specialized Indian Film Festivals outside cultural exchange protocols.
- (3) Special Indian Panorama Festivals in India

#### 4. SECTIONS

The Indian Panorama will have the following sections:-

- (1) Feature films, and
- (2) Non-feature films,

## 5. INDIAN PANORAMA

A maximum of 26 feature films and 21 Non-feature films (including the Best Feature and Best Non-feature films from 56<sup>th</sup> National Films Awards, 2008 and 57<sup>th</sup> National Film Awards, 2009), distinguished by cinematic, thematic and aesthetic excellence selected in accordance with the conditions and procedure laid down below will feature in the Indian Panorama.

## 6. ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS

The following conditions must be fulfilled by all entries:

6.1 The film should be in any Indian language. The Phrase 'any Indian language' would mean all official languages of the State/Union Territories of the Indian Union, all other Indian languages included in Schedule VIII of the Constitution of India and such other languages and dialects that may be permitted by the Government of India from time to time.

6.2 The film should have been produced in India. In the case of co-productions involving a foreign entity, the following conditions should be fulfilled:

6.2.1 At least one of the co-producers must be an Indian entity.

6.2.2 The Indian entity should be registered in India or a citizen of India

6.2.3 The title of the film should be registered as an Indian film title.

6.2.4 The Director should be an Indian national and the cast and technicians should be predominantly Indian nationals. However, non-feature films directed by the foreign students of Film Institutes situated in India will be eligible if their entries are sent through their respective Institutes.

6.2.5 The negative should be available with the right holder in India to strike prints.

6.2.6 The applicant should have the right for sanctioning participation of the film in festivals in India and abroad as an Indian entry as well as special expositions of Indian cinema organised by the DFF.

6.3 Films should have been certified by the Central Board of Film Certification between **1<sup>st</sup> September 2009 to 31<sup>st</sup> August 2010**.

6.4 Films made in any Indian language, shot on 16 mm, 35 mm or in a wider gauge or digital format and certified by the Central Board of Film Certification for release on a film format or digital/video format and as a feature film or a featurette are eligible for the **Feature Film Section**.

6.5 Films made in any Indian language, shot on 16 mm, 35 mm or in a wider gauge or digital format and certified by the Central Board of Film Certification for release on a film format or digital/video format, and as a Documentary/News Reel/Non-Fiction/Short Fiction are eligible for the **Non-Feature Film Section**.

6.6 The question whether a film is a feature film or non-feature film will be decided on the basis of such categorization as mentioned in the Censor Certificate submitted by the entrant.

6.7 Dubbed versions are not eligible for entry.

6.8 Entries of films in language other than English and Hindi, **MUST** carry English subtitles.

6.9 The Film Federation of India and the Film and Television Producers Guild of India Ltd. will nominate a list of ten films each based on popular appeal and box office receipts for selection in the Indian Panorama 2010. The Jury will select five films from this list for inclusion in the Indian Panorama.

6.10 (a) A maximum of **five** entries would be allowed from individuals, producers, Production Units, Government organizations, companies.

6.10 (b) A maximum of **ten** student films would be allowed from film and media institutions.

6.11 **Disqualification:**

The following shall not be eligible:-

6.11 (a) A programme originally made for television and entered in its telecast format with breaks, advertisements, logos etc.

6.11 (b) Entries should preferably **NOT** carry captions such as 'preview copy', channel logo etc. **However, if the screening copy bears the captions, it should be so faint as not to disturb the viewing experience.**

## 7. PROCEDURE FOR ENTERING FILMS

7.1 The producer and /or right holder may apply on the prescribed entry forms (Form IP-I along with Forms IP-II and III) along with a copy of the certificate issued by Central Board of Film Certification.

7.2 Each entry form shall be accompanied by the material detailed below (soft copy of the same to be emailed to **ip10dff@gmail.com**):

(a) **Two** DVD copies of the film

(b) Synopsis of the film, Director's Profile and Director's Note in English.

(c) Film Stills (8-10 nos), 25x20cms. Director's photo (**to be sent by email, 600 dpi / 15-20MB**),

(d) Bio-data of the Director and Director's Note on film should also be e-mailed on **ip10dff@gmail.com**

(e) **In case the film is selected**, the following should be submitted immediately.

1 Six posters of the film

2 A poster CD

3 A 3 minute promo/trailer

4 Master Digibeta and Betacam SP (Broadcast quality) tapes of the film.

(f) Six still photographs of scenes from the film (approx. 20 cms X 25 cms) on glossy paper.

(g) An affidavit shall be furnished by the applicant on a stamp paper of the value of Rs.20/- duly verified, declaring that the information furnished in the entry form and other forms submitted is true to the best of his/her knowledge, that the DVD of the film being submitted as required under clause 7.6 below, is the certified version and that the applicant has not made any change whatsoever after certification by the Central Board of Film Certification.

7.3 Entries must be sent along with a non-refundable fee of Rs. 5,000/- for feature films and Rs. 1,500/- for non-feature films. The fee should be remitted through a crossed Demand Draft in favour of the "Pay & Accounts Officer (Main Secretariat), Ministry of Information and Broadcasting" payable at the State Bank of India, New Delhi.

7.4 The last date for receipt of applications along-with supporting materials is **10<sup>th</sup> September 2010**. In case 10<sup>th</sup> September 2010 is a holiday, the next working day will be treated as the last date for receipt of DVDs/entries. Applications received after the last date would be rejected.

7.6 **ONLY DVD** copies may be sent for selection purposes. DVDs of all non-English and non-Hindi language films **MUST** carry English subtitles.

**The label of the cover of the DVD shall contain the following details :**

- 1) Title of the film
- 2) The full name of the Director
- 3) The full name of the Producer
- 4) Duration of the film
- 5) Original language of the film
- 6) Date of Censor Certification

7.7 All cost for sending the DVDs and accompanying material to the Directorate shall be borne by the person entering the film/s.

7.8 In case any of the requirements mentioned in this part of the Regulations are not complied with by the applicant, the entry is liable to be rejected summarily.

## **8. SELECTION OF INDIAN PANORAMA**

8.1 The Indian Panorama will be selected by two duly constituted juries, one for Feature films and the other for non-Feature films. Adequate representation will be made from the major regional production centers to serve on the juries. The Juries for selection shall comprise 10 members (including the Chairperson) for feature films and 5 members (including the Chairperson) for non-feature films.

8.2 The Chairperson of the Feature Film Jury may constitute a maximum of three panels from amongst the members of the jury. Each panel will recommend not more than 33% of the films viewed by it for combined viewing by the full jury.

**8.3 A person will be ineligible to serve on a Jury ONLY if his own film is an entry. In the event of his/her close relative being associated with a particular film, the jury member shall recuse himself/herself from the preview of the film.**

8.3.1 A person appointed as Chairperson or member of the jury shall make the declaration in writing in the form given in Form IP-IV annexed to these regulations.

8.4 The Director of the Directorate and/or his/her nominee may be present at the time of the deliberations of the panels only to provide information/clarifications if any, required by the panels regarding the entries. They shall not participate in any of the deliberations.

8.5 The decision of the juries shall be final and binding and no appeal or correspondence regarding their decision shall be entertained.

8.6 The films selected for the Best Feature Film and Best non-Feature Film from 56<sup>th</sup> National Film Awards, 2008 and 57<sup>th</sup> National Film Awards, 2009 will also be included in the Indian Panorama notwithstanding the provisions contained in clause 6.3 of these Regulations.

## **9. ACQUISITION OF PRINTS OF FILMS SELECTED FOR THE INDIAN PANORAMA**

9.1 In case a film is selected for the Indian Panorama, the Directorate will have the right to buy, on behalf of the Government of India, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, one or more prints thereof, at a cost not exceeding the actual price of the raw material and processing charges.

9.2 The Directorate shall have the right to get the print subtitled in English or/and in other languages.

9.3 The Directorate shall have the right to strike foreign language subtitled prints as per programming requirements, for non-commercial use. The Directorate shall have the right to make one Beta copy of the film and copies of DVDs from the DVD entries of the film selected under Indian Panorama, 2010 for non-commercial screenings as specified under clause 11.2 of the Regulations for Indian Panorama, 2010.

9.4 The Directorate shall have the right to replace the existing prints, subtitled or otherwise, once it is certified as damaged.

9.5 In the case of a film selected for the Indian Panorama, all the material referred to in Regulations 7.2 shall be kept by the Directorate for use as and when necessary. The producer

shall also supply, on request of the Directorate, additional publicity material to the Directorate to facilitate the participation of the film in various festivals as detailed in Regulation.

9.6 The National Film Development Corporation will also have the right to buy one print of each of the films selected for the Indian Panorama at a cost not exceeding the actual price of the raw material and processing charges.

9.7 The authorization in form ID-II shall be made use of by the National Film Archive of India, Pune for preservation and archival purposes. The authorization in forms ID-III shall be made use of by the Directorate for the purposes and manner mentioned in Regulation 11, only in case a film is selected for the Indian Panorama.

## **10 RETURN OF DVD**

DVD copies of films not selected will be returned to the producer shortly after the final meeting of the Selection Panel. The Directorate shall bear the cost of returning the DVD to the address of the sender.

## **11. USE OF INDIAN PANORAMA FILMS**

11.1 The Indian Panorama films will initially be screened at the Indian Panorama Section of the International Film Festival of India, provided that no claim of any kind would lie against the Directorate for their inability to show a film due to technical or any other reasons.

11.2 Films from the Indian Panorama will be used for participation in various international film festivals, film weeks, Indian Panorama festivals and other non-commercial screenings, within the country and abroad at the discretion of Directorate of Film Festivals and the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting. For all such screenings, the producer will not be eligible for any payment. He /She will however, be kept informed of such screenings.

11.3 The prints purchased by the National Film Development Corporation under these Regulations will be utilized for organizing Indian Panorama Festivals and will not be utilized for any commercial purposes.

## **12. ARBITRATION**

In case any dispute arises between the Producer and the Directorate, the same shall be referred to the Secretary, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, Government of India, whose decision in the matter shall be final and binding on both the parties. The Arbitration Clause, however, will not apply on the decision of Juries, which will be final and binding on both the Directorate of Film Festivals and the applicant for Indian Panorama.
